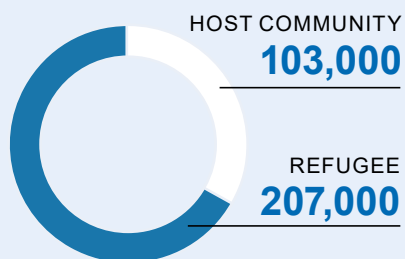


Energy Solutions for Displacement Settings (ESDS)

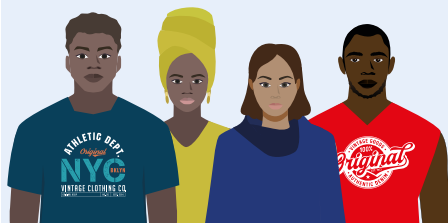

ESDS is a component of the German Federal Ministry for Economic Cooperation and Development (BMZ) commissioned Global Programme with UNHCR. GIZ implements the component and works closely with UNHCR and local partners to provide energy solutions that cater to the needs of both refugee and host communities in project countries – Ethiopia, Kenya and Uganda. ESDS works through three intervention areas – improving the policy framework; greening the UNHCR infrastructure; and increasing market-based energy access, thereby, contributing to the implementation of UNHCR's [Global Strategy for Sustainable Energy](#). The current implementation timeline for ESDS is between 2018–2024.

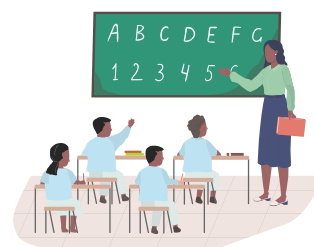

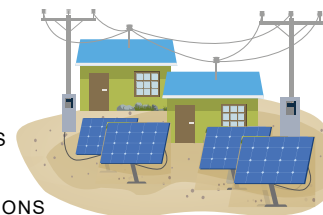

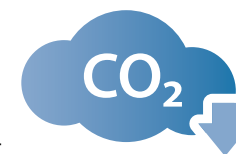
